**July 26, 2025 – The Lost Art of Intercession – James Goll & Myra Ilagan**

Let us continue to ponder on our priestly role of intercession.

In Leviticus 16, God gave Moses very detailed instructions about the laws of atonement and the priestly progression into God's progression, and they contain something you and I need to understand in our day:

Leviticus 16:12-13 NKJV

[12] Then he shall take a censer full of burning coals of fire from the altar before the Lord, with his hands full of sweet incense beaten fine, and bring it inside the veil. [13] And he shall put the incense on the fire before the Lord, that the cloud of incense may cover the mercy seat that is on the Testimony, lest he die.

Leviticus 24:2-3 NKJV

[2] "Command the children of Israel that they bring to you pure oil of pressed olives for the light, to make the lamps burn continually. [3] Outside the veil of the Testimony, in the tabernacle of meeting, Aaron shall be in charge of it from evening until morning before the Lord continually; it shall be a statute forever in your generations.

It doesn't stop once you are in God's presence. Again, holiness and purity are requirements to be in God's presence. But we also to bring our oil and once we are in the Most Holy Place of God's presence, we are to make the lamps burning continually. We are to bring our prayers which are incense rising and filling up the golden bowls in the throne room.

Revelation 5:8 NKJV

[8] Now when He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each having a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.

In that place, as priests of the Lord, we also offer continual sacrifices of praise, worship, and adoration. Let us keep the fire of the altar continually burning.

Leviticus 6:9 NKJV

[9] "Command Aaron and his sons, saying, 'This is the law of the burnt offering: The burnt offering shall be on the hearth upon the altar all night until morning, and the fire of the altar shall be kept burning on it.
